Fire Alarm Practice – Well Done Everyone!

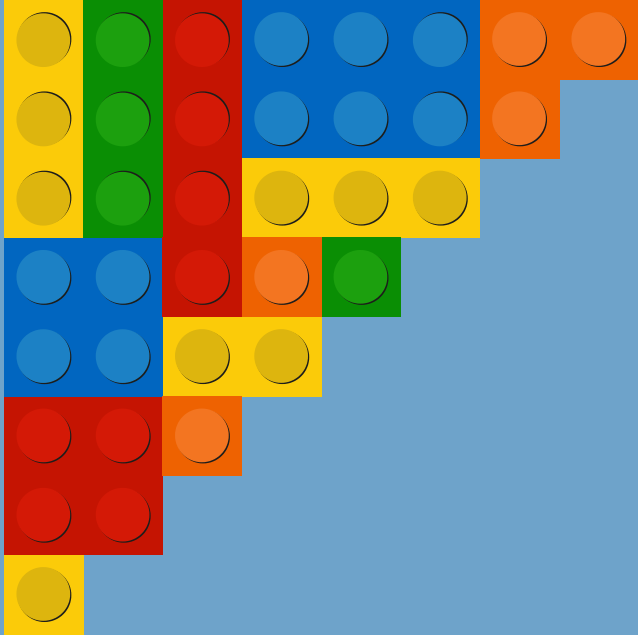
On Wednesday, we held a planned fire alarm practice led by Mrs Angeloff.

Building Bright Minds with Lego League!



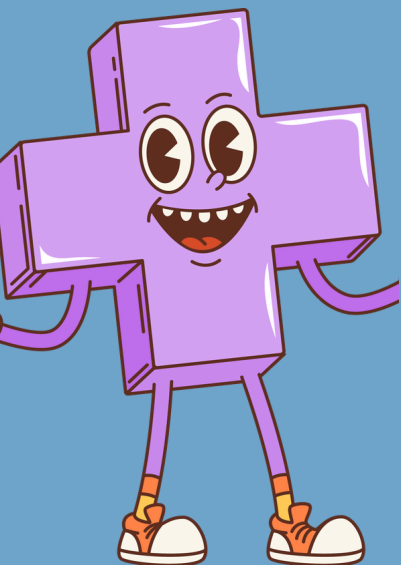

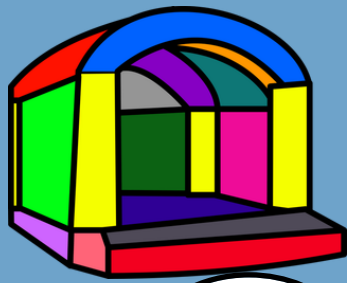

We are bouncing into summer with a super-fun, free reward for all the children after their hard work this year!

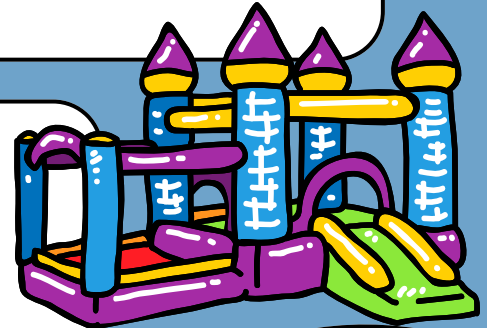
The children will enjoy:

This is a wonderful example of our school value of ownership, with Matilda & Ole taking the lead to make a positive difference and help others.

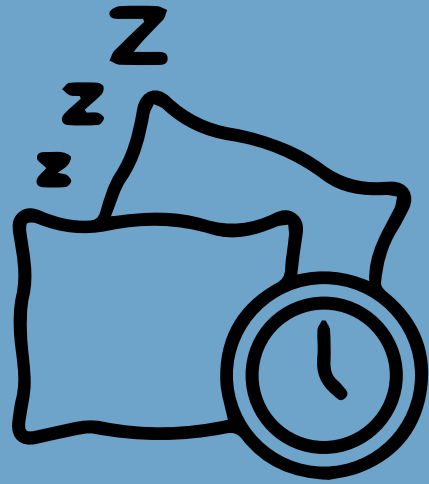
The cake sale will take place on Friday 22nd May during the school day. Children can bring 50p to buy a cake of their choice.

Being in school every day helps your child learn, make friends, and do their best.

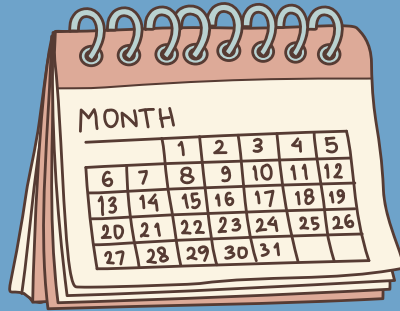
If a child misses 19 days or more, they are classed as a persistent absentee. This can affect their learning.
