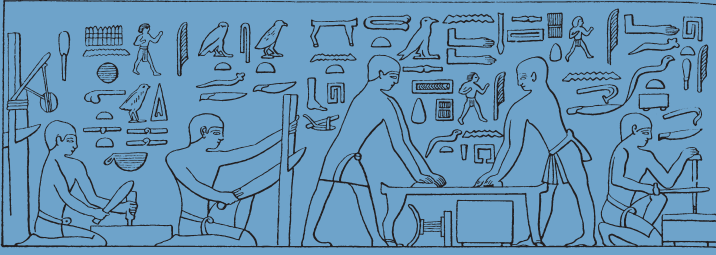


A Journey Back to Ancient Egypt!

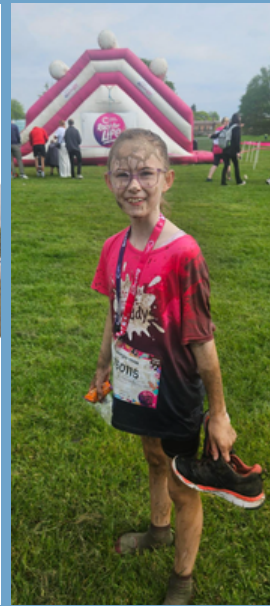
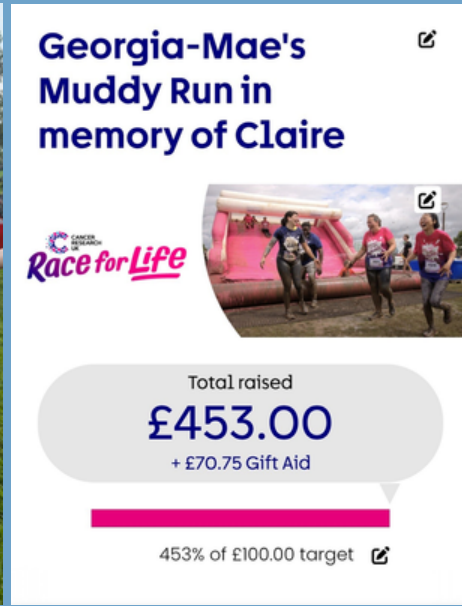

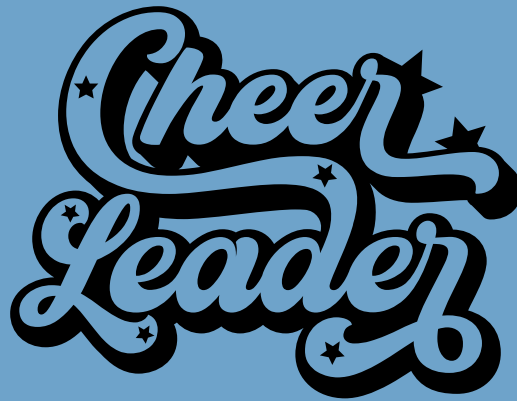
We are very proud of Rosie for her hard work and for taking on new challenges—fantastic effort!

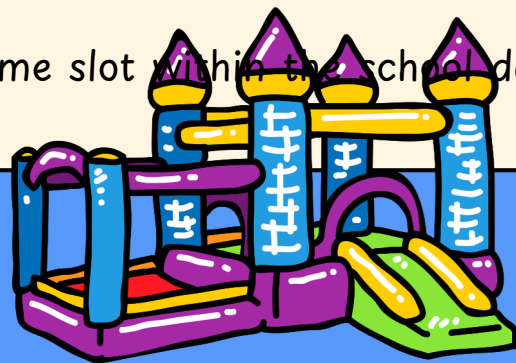


We are bouncing into summer with a super-fun, free reward for all the children after their hard work this year!

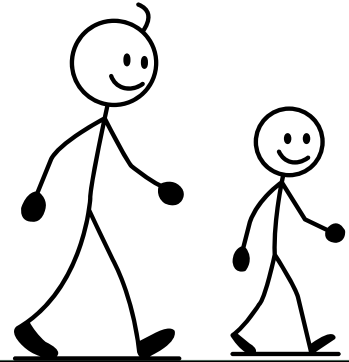

Warmer Weather Ahead!

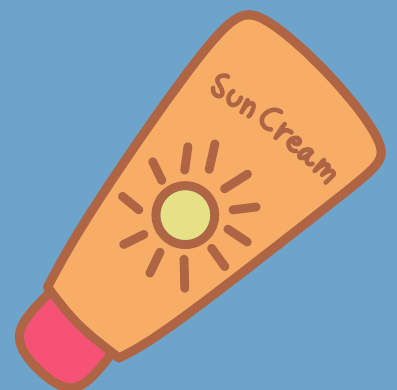
With temperatures set to rise next week and plenty of sunshine on the way, we're looking forward to enjoying the outdoors!

Please remember to send your child in with:

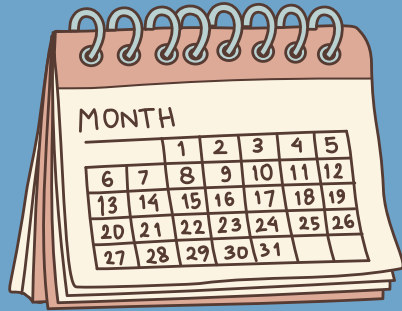
- Suncream (applied before they arrive, with a named bottle for reapplication if needed)

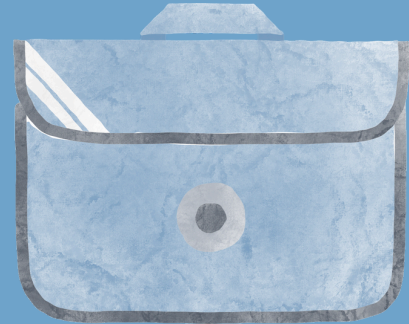

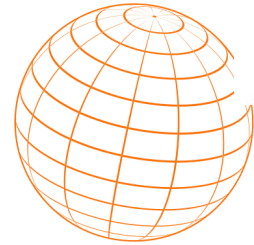

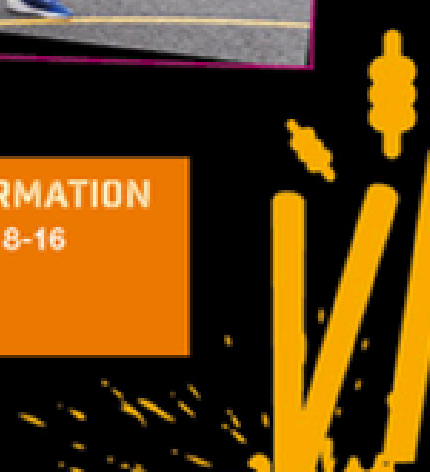
